MINISTER'S LETTER

My dear brothers and sisters,

May the Lord grant you peace!

As you may recall from reading my article in the June *Poverello*, Br. Pat led us through an experience of Appreciative Inquiry at our fraternity gathering in May. Because everyone agreed that it was a very positive experience and wanted to continue the process, Br. Pat agreed to lead us through the second phase of the Appreciative Inquiry process at the fraternity gathering in June. However, all of our plans for the fraternity gathering changed when we received the sad news that our sister and friend, **Faye Boland**, passed away on Thursday, June 10.

Faye attended her granddaughter's high school graduation on Sunday, June 6. After the ceremony, Faye and Joe went to their son's home for a family party. As Faye and Joe were driving away from their son's home, Faye slumped over in the car. An ambulance was called and Faye was rushed to the hospital. Faye had suffered a stroke. On Wednesday, Faye underwent surgery to relieve pressure on her brain. On Thursday, we received the news that Faye had died.

Because of this news, Br. Pat and I decided to forego the planned agenda for the fraternity gathering on June 13 and instead to hold a prayer service in remembrance of Faye. Since this would be the first time many of our fraternity members would learn of Faye's death, we decided to provide people with an opportunity to share stories of Faye and what she meant to them.

At 7:00 p.m. that evening, many of our fraternity members gathered together with our brother, Joe, and Faye's family and friends for a Franciscan Vigil Service at the Wujek-Calcaterra Funeral Home. We remembered and celebrated the gift of Faye, offered our love and support to our brother Joe and their entire family. I am grateful to all of you who shared heartwarming memories of our vibrant, fun-loving, and Spirit-filled sister, Faye. Please pray for Joe and their entire family during their time of sorrow.

Informational Items

In early May, I received an e-mail from **Faye Boland** requesting that the fraternity purchase a paver in honor of **Fr. Jogues Constance**, former Spiritual Assistant of our fraternity. The Leadership Council, at its June meeting, approved the purchase of a paver to be located on the grounds of the Solanus Casey Center in honor of Fr. Jogues. The paver will be installed some time in September.

Br. Pat and I met individually with each of the four persons who completed the inquiry phase of the formation process. At the beginning of our fraternity gathering on July 18th, we will have a brief ceremony to welcome Tony, Ruby, Ilene and Therese into the candidacy program. I ask that you keep them in your prayers as they continue to discern their vocation into the Secular Franciscan Order.

At our fraternity gathering on June 13th, I announced that I was elected to serve as Councilor for the Divine Mercy Regional Fraternity. I am excited to have this opportunity to get to know more of my Franciscan brothers and sisters, to learn more about and be of greater service to the Secular Franciscan Order.

I look forward to seeing you at our fraternity picnic on Sunday, July 18th at 1:30 p.m.

Remembering Faye...

Faye Marie Hebert was born in Ecorse, Michigan, on September 23, 1934 to Woodford and Berenece Hebert. She was the eldest of three children – herself, Nancy and Gerald. After a few years in Port Huron, she moved to Detroit where she was graduated from St. Ambrose HS.

While in her teens, and at the invitation of her future husband, **Ken Kluk**, she joined the Third Order of St. Francis [aka Secular Franciscan Order] – a religious fraternity for lay people that hosted a number of social events. She remained active in the Secular Franciscans for the remaining 60 years of her life. She and Joe went to churches throughout the archdiocese leading informational meetings about the SFO. Most recently, she was on the vocations commission and special events committee, and wrote the monthly column, Brothers and Sisters, for the *Poverello*. After his return from the Korean War, Faye and Ken were married on May 21, 1954.

Faye was always active – a social butterfly. After high school, she and 11 of her dearest friends formed the “Girls Club”. Besides Faye, it included [the late] **Mary Bartnik**, [the late] **Elda Christianson**, **Charlotte Heymes**, **Eleanor Heymes**, **Peggy Langer**, [the late] **Jean Knudson Wenett**, **Mary Ann Montpetit**, **Terry Pfaendtner**, [the late] **Marci Rathsburg**, **Sally Reno** and **Marilyn Ricard**. Those 12 women met monthly to share their lives – their joys, sorrows, laughs and tears. Once a year they even let their husbands come to their meeting.

Family was very important to Faye. She and Ken had six children – Ken, Steve, Ed, Julie, Theresa and Mike.

Through the years, she was actively involved in many prayer groups, the InterFaith Group, St. Matthew’s Folk Group, **Fr. Solanus Cell Group**, St. John Berchman’s prayer group, St. John Berchman’s Camping Club, pinochle club, and probably many others we cannot remember.

She worked at the Detroit Board of Education, Bunch Elementary School, Kahn and Kahn Law Firm, and Dickinson, Write, Moon, VanDusen and Freeman [the latter being where she worked until her retirement].

After 26 years of marriage, her first husband, Ken, passed away. Never one to keep still, Faye continued to be active in her churches (St. Bonaventure’s, St. Al’s downtown, and St. Matthew’s). She met her future husband, fellow St. Matthew’s parishioner and widower, **Joe Boland**, at the Noon Mass at St. Al’s downtown. After dating for awhile, they were married on March 17, 1984. With their marriage, the family instantly grew with Joe’s 8 children – Pat, Terry, Cathy, Tom, Jan, Ken, Paul and Rick. Always one to make sure no one was excluded, all 14 of the “kids” stood up at their wedding at St. Matthew’s.

With Joe, they were involved with the Starcraft Camping Club, the Sunnybrook Camping Club. Joe joined the Secular Franciscans of St. Bonaventure Fraternity, and together they continued to be very active Secular Franciscans.

Faye loved a good party. Since her family was so large – 14 children and their spouses, and her grandchildren – , it was difficult to get together all in one place. So every five years, Faye and Joe had a weekend anniversary party where they rented 20+ rooms and all (or most) of the family – children, grandchildren, spouses and great-grandchildren – would spend a wonderful weekend together. In July 2009, on the occasion of Faye and Joe’s 25 years of marriage, the weekend celebration included a dinner dance with family and friends.

Faye loved her grandchildren. She made birthday cakes for each of their birthdays from ages 1 to 16. She would ask the grandchild what flavor cake and what design he/she wanted. Faye made cakes in the shape of clowns, castles, fire engines, Barbies, Red Wings, Tweety Birds, soccer balls – anything the child requested. And it didn’t matter if the child lived locally or out-of-state – she always made them a cake.

Faye loved to play cards. She taught all of her grandchildren to play cards. They would play One Card. She would give the kids three nickels to play so they didn’t lose any of their own money. She also liked to play Uno and Bingo (she would always have prizes). She passed her love of God, love of family and love of life on to the next generation.

Faye and Joe kept a full bag of new toys in the closet, and frequently let visiting grandchildren choose one (not a quick task due to the variety). They also took the bag when they visited out-of-town grandchildren so that they

could get some goodies, as well.

Recently, Joe and Faye would spend a couple of winter months in Florida with friends from Michigan and new friends, dancing, playing cards and usually enjoying warmer weather.

Faye kept photo albums of the important events in each of her grandchildren's lives with the intention of giving the photo album to the grandchild and his/her spouse on their wedding day. In total, she had 88 photo albums, chronicling 22 grandchildren's lives – a testament to her love.

Faye attended her granddaughter Sarah's graduation on June 6, 2010, and as always had a great time. As she was leaving, she suffered a massive stroke. She spent a few days in the hospital in the company of Joe, her children and loved ones – being conscious for minutes as a time over those days. After undergoing surgery on Wednesday, Faye quietly passed away on Thursday morning.

We all have plenty of great memories of Faye, and we're sure she's planning some parties in heaven with all of her friends and family members that went before her. May her good works follow her, and may she rest in peace!

In other news, the Executive Council of Divine Mercy Regional Fraternity met at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Grand Rapids on Saturday, June 5, 2010. During the course of that meeting they accepted with regret the resignation of the Regional Minister, Roger Ensign.

Rule Reflection for July

SFO Rule, Art. 16; SFO Constitutions, Art. 21

SFO Rule, Art. 16

Let them esteem work both as a gift and as a sharing in the creation, redemption, and service of the human community.

SFO Constitutions, Article 21

1. *Rule, Art. 16* – For Francis, work is a gift and to work is a grace. Daily work is not only the means of livelihood, but the opportunity to serve God and neighbor, as well as a way to develop one’s own personality. In the conviction that work is a right and a duty and that every form of occupation deserves respect, the brothers and sisters should commit themselves to collaborate so that all persons may have the possibility to work and so that working conditions may always be more humane.

2. Leisure and recreation have their own value and are necessary for personal development. Secular Franciscans should maintain a balance between work and rest and should strive to create meaningful forms of using leisure time [see *Gaudium et Spes* 67; *Laborem exercens* 16 ff.]

- 2) How well do you balance work and leisure?

Celebrating Joseph Driessen



Joe Driessen was born on January 4, 1931 to Joseph and Grace (Hayden) Driessen in Appleton, Wisconsin. He has three sisters: Sarah, Joan and Betty. Joe was baptized at St. Joseph's Church in Appleton by Fr. Englebert Rosenmeyer, OFM Cap.

When Joe was a young child, his family moved to Detroit and lived in a house on Mt. Elliott. Joe attended first grade at Our Lady of Sorrows, second through fifth grades at Lillibridge Elementary School, sixth grade at Foch Intermediate School, seventh grade at St. Rose, and eighth grade at St. David where he was taught by Sisters of St. Joseph. After graduating from St. Joseph High School in Detroit, he enrolled in classes at the University of Detroit – Jefferson campus for one year.

On the completion of his first year of college, Joe entered the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance (Trappists). He was a lay brother in the Order for 5 ½ years. After leaving the Order, he had difficulty finding a job, and so volunteered for military service and served as a clerk in the Army for two years. During his Army service, Joe was stationed at the 33rd field hospital in Fontainebleau, France.

After his tour of duty, Joe was employed as a clerk with the Motor Transportation Department for the City of Detroit for four years. He left that job in order to join the Franciscans (OFM) as a brother in Oldenburg, Indiana. During his novitiate, he decided to leave.

Joe then worked in the store room at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital for 12 years. Following his recuperation from a back injury, Joe began working as a parking lot attendant

at the hospital. After working in this position for 11 years, Joe was permanently laid off.

Joe enrolled in computer accounting classes at Dorothy Business School for one year. Upon completion of the program, he worked at K and K Tile Company for one year and then for a year at the St. John - Bon Secours Senior Community as a security guard. Following this job, Joe retired.

When Joe was 47 years old, he was living at the League of Catholic Women home; the fourth floor of the home was reserved for men. Joe invited one of the residents at the home to attend a dance at St. Alphonsus Church in Dearborn. It was at this dance that Joe met Rose. In May of 1979, Joe and Rose were married at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Dearborn.

When Joe was a senior in high school, his classmate, Tony Hellow, asked him if he wanted to have some fun that night. Joe responded yes and they went to the St. Bonaventure Third Order meeting where young adults had an opportunity to socialize with one another, a chance to play ping pong, and rehearsals were taking place for the Passion Play.

Joe was professed into the Secular Franciscan Third Order on October 21, 1949 in Fr. Lawrence Merton's office. Fr. Lawrence wanted Joe to be professed into the Third Order before he departed for the monastery.

Joe and Rose are parishioners at St. Clement Church in Dearborn where he serves as an acolyte at funeral Masses. He is a member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and Treasurer of the St. Paul Council of the Knights of Columbus. In his spare time, Joe enjoys reading religious books.
