MINISTER'S LETTER

My dear brothers and sisters,

May God's peace and joy reign in your heart!

At our fraternity gathering on August 15, we welcomed **Leticia Aguilar** and **Javier Aguilar** into the inquiry phase of formation. Welcome, Leticia and Javier, to our Secular Franciscan family. At the same gathering, Brother Pat led us through the first phase of the appreciative inquiry process. Once again, everyone left the fraternity gathering feeling energized and proud to be a member of our fraternity. I want to strongly encourage you to attend the Day of Reflection on Sunday, September 19 at 11:00 a.m. when Brother Pat will help us to experience the next phases of the process – Dreaming and Design. The timing of the final phase, Destiny, has not been determined yet.

I want to extend a personal invitation to you, your family and friends to join our Capuchin Brothers in celebrating the **Transitus** (Passing) of St. Francis on Sunday, October 3 at 7:00 p.m. in the Monastery Chapel and to attend the **Solanus Casey Concert** on Sunday, October 10 at 3:00 p.m. in the same Chapel. I am grateful to **Teresa Westbrook-Lienert**, chair of the Concert committee, and the other members of the committee for all of their time and effort in planning this event. More detailed information about these events is included on the following pages of this newsletter.

In preparation for the commemoration of the passing of our Seraphic Father, St. Francis of Assisi, from his earthly life to his heavenly reward, I would like to offer for your reflection the following reading describing the last days and hours of St. Francis's life.

Readings from Br. Thomas of Celano and St. Bonaventure

“St. Francis spent the last few days before his death in praising the Lord and teaching his companions whom he loved so much to praise Christ with him. He himself, in as far as he was able, broke out with the Psalm: ‘I cry to the Lord with my voice; to the Lord I make loud supplication.’ He likewise invited all creatures to praise God and, with the word he had composed earlier, he exhorted them to love God. Even death itself, considered by all to be so terrible and hateful, was exhorted to give praise, while he himself, going joyfully to meet it, invited it to make its abode with him. ‘Welcome,’ he said, ‘my sister death.’” (Celano, Second Life).

“When the hour of his death approached, Francis asked that all of the brothers living with him be called to his death bed and softening his departure with consoling words, he encouraged them with fatherly affection to love God. He spoke of patience and poverty and of being faithful to the holy Roman Church, giving precedence to the holy Gospels before all else. He then stretched his hands over the brothers in the form of a cross, a symbol that he loved so much, and gave his blessing to all followers, both present and absent, in the power and in the name of the Crucified. Then he added: ‘Remain, my sons, in the fear of the Lord and be with him always. And as temptations and trials beset you, blessed are those who persevere to the end in the life they have chosen. I am on my way to God and I commend you all to his favor’.

“With this sweet admonition, this dearly beloved to God, asked that the book of the Gospels be brought to him and that the passage in the Gospel of St. John, which begins, ‘before the Feast of the Passover’ be read. Finally, when all God's mysteries had been accomplished in him, his holy soul was freed from his body and assumed into the abyss of God's glory, and Francis fell asleep in God.” (Bonaventure, Major Life).

Looking forward to seeing you at the Day of Reflection on September 19. Have a restful and fun Labor Day weekend.

Celebrating Anthony M. Lienert



Tony was born to Robert Marcellus Lienert (1926-1988) and Audrey Jean Gagnon (b. 1924) on January 8, 1963 in Mt. Clemens, Michigan. Tony is the youngest of his four siblings Paul (Anita), Jean (Tim Jennings), Ted (Joann), and Tom. He attended first and second grades at

Anchor Bay Catholic Elementary School (now Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception) in Anchorville (hometown of Archbishop Vigneron), and third through twelfth grades at Anchor Bay Elementary, Junior High & High School in New Baltimore. Tony graduated from Michigan State University in 1985 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Horticulture.

Tony was employed at Ray Wiegand's Nursery in Macomb from 1986-2001, served as an adjunct faculty member from 1998-2003 at St. Clair County Community College in Port Huron, worked at Perennial Impressions in Oxford from 2002-2003 and Glenda's Garden Center in Novi from 2006-2008. He is currently employed at Eradico Services in Novi as a Tree/Shrub Care Technician and Diagnostician.

Tony married Teresa Rose Westbrook on August 12, 1995 at St. Mary, Queen of Creation Church in New Baltimore. The ceremony was performed by Fr. Nicholas Zukowski, assisted by Deacon Richard Hulan, SFO. Other Fraternity members in attendance included Ben and Dorothy Stapel, Joe Doeran and Maxine Piaszeczny. Congratulations to Tony and Terry on their 15th Wedding Anniversary! We wish you many more years of happiness together.

Tony learned about the Secular Franciscan Order through one of his college friends, Steve Spreitzer, who suggested that he might make a good Franciscan. Tony was thinking about the priesthood at the time, so he decided to consider various Franciscan communities. It

was eventually determined (on account of his personal quirks and eccentricities) that community life was not his calling; a friar told him, however, that he would always be a Franciscan. While dating Terry, Tony learned that she was inquiring into the SFO, and he decided to explore a vocation as a Secular Franciscan. The rest, as they say, is history.

Tony has served the St. Bonaventure Secular Franciscan Fraternity in the following capacities: as a speaker on Franciscan spirituality for Franciscan Information Nights (with Terry and Joe and Faye Boland); presented teachings at Third Sunday Meetings including Franciscans and the Arts; Franciscanism and the 12 Steps; co-chair of the Hospitality Commission; and lector for fraternity events.

Tony is a parishioner at St. Gregory the Great Catholic Church in Detroit, Michigan and serves in the music ministry at his parish. In his free time, he enjoys reading, cemetery and nature walks, genealogy (motto: "I chase dead people"), cooking and internet surfing.

Tony shared this reflection on the Franciscan way of life: "To me, Franciscan life is more than something I do; it's a life to be lived, striving to leave myself open to being regularly refined by the fire of God. Many days, one may see little progress, or even regression. The life of fraternity, however, is tremendously supportive through both the joys and sorrows of life. In my Franciscan family, I've found tremendous diversity in living the charisma, and the spirit of joy that carries one through times of sorrow; some of my richest Franciscan moments have been when we gather to honor the passing of a member of the family, and declare 'Blessed are they that Death finds doing your will.' Another touching moment for me was one year, during the Transitus, when I was asked to help break and distribute bread in memory of Francis' final sharing. It was a most humbling experience, to act in imitation of our Seraphic Father."

Rule Reflection for September

SFO Rule, Art. 19; SFO Constitutions, Art. 23

SFO Rule, II, Art. 19

Mindful that they are bearers of peace which must be built up unceasingly, they should seek out ways of unity and fraternal harmony through dialogue, trusting in the presence of the divine seed in everyone and in the transforming power of love and pardon. Messengers of perfect joy in every circumstance, they should strive to bring joy and hope to others. Since they are immersed in the resurrection of Christ, which gives true meaning to Sister Death, let them serenely tend toward the ultimate encounter with the Father.

SFO Constitutions, Article 23

1. **Rule Art. 19** Peace is the work of justice and the fruit of reconciliation and of fraternal love (see *Gaudium et Spes*, 78). Secular Franciscans are called to be bearers of peace in their families and in society:
 - they should see to the proposal and spreading of peaceful ideas and attitudes;
 - they should develop their own initiatives and should collaborate, individually and as a fraternity, with initiatives of the Pope, the local Churches, and the Franciscan Family;
 - they should collaborate with those movements and institutions which promote peace while respecting its authentic foundations.
2. While acknowledging both the personal and national right to legitimate defense, they should respect the choice of those who, because of conscientious objection, refuse to bear arms.
3. To preserve peace in the family, the brothers and sisters should, in due time, make a last will and testament for the disposition of their goods.

Personal Reflection: One of the reasons for making a will is to preserve peace in the family when you die. Have you made a will?

Shared Reflection: Do you consider yourself a peacemaker? Do others consider you a peacemaker?

Coco 7 years old medulloblastoma

Coco was enjoying a beautiful spring day in the park with her three siblings and her mom, Robbi. Suddenly, she fell from the monkey bars and screamed out in pain. A CT scan of Coco's head revealed a cancerous tumor growing in the little girl's brain. Coco had emergency surgery to remove the tumor, and then was referred to St. Jude Children's

Research Hospital for treatment.

At St. Jude, doctors diagnosed Coco with medulloblastoma, a rare and aggressive brain tumor. She began a protocol of radiation, followed by chemotherapy. Robbi has found encouragement from the family-centered care offered at St. Jude. "The doctors and nurses are very supportive here," she said. "No matter what's bothering you, someone is there to help you and explain things."

Coco's family is grateful for the donors who help support St. Jude. "St. Jude told me, 'let that be your last worry. The only thing you need to be worried about is getting Coco better,'" Robbi said. "It lifted a burden from me." Today, Coco is doing well. She returns to St. Jude every few months for checkups. She likes playing board games and watching movies.

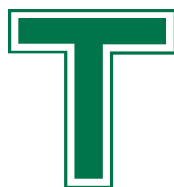
